

Basilic hiatus

Basilic hiatus (*Hiatus basilicus*) is an opening in the fascia brachii through which the **basilic vein** passes from the surface to the depth. **Nervus cutaneus antebrachii medialis**, on the other hand, emerges from depth. There may be small superficial lymph nodes (*nodi lymphatici cubitales*) around the hiatus basilicus.
