

# Berry's Ligament

Berry's ligament spans between the thyroid glands capsule and the cricoid and thyroid cartilage.<sup>[1]</sup> It is of great importance in thyroid surgery - it has an intimate relationship with the `n. laryngeus recurrens. *Together with the `lobus pyramidalis*, it is the place along which tissue remnants most often remain after thyroidectomy.<sup>[2]</sup>
