

# Rolandic syndrome

The **central region** is (along with the prefrontal region) one of the two parts of the frontal lobe.

**Rolandic (central) syndrome** includes symptoms from the praecentralis and postcentralis gyrus, which can be irritating and destructive.

- A typical irritating manifestation of **Jackson motor epilepsy** (gyrus praecentralis, tonic/clonic convulsions).
- The terminal manifestation is **contralateral** paresis.
- Expressive (motor, non-fluent) aphasia (Broca speech center).
