Healthcare systems can be divided into two basic models according to the method of payment for the provided health care:

1. **Insurance-based health systems:**
 - public (compulsory) health insurance – Bismarckian model of health care;
 - private (voluntary) health insurance – liberal model of healthcare (market healthcare).
2. **State health care**' (health care paid for by public funds, taxes) - national health service:
 - Beveridge model;
 - Semaška's model.
