The emergence of e-journals and e-books

- the Internet and the WWW (World Wide Web) service are responsible for everything
- the expansion and popularity of the WWW brought with it new possibilities in publishing
- The 90s of the 20th century brought the question - will the classic book disappear?
- contemporary – symbiosis of classics and e-version
- the emergence of purely electronic magazines (e.g. IKAROS)
- ADVANTAGE – availability 24/7 (24 hours, 7 days a week)

Current Status - License Policy

- current and further development is determined by the license policy of the publishers
 - is based on an agreement with the user – consortium, institution, etc.
- print and online version at the same time
 - online completely free
 - free after a certain period - so-called "embargo" (ranging from 1/2 year to 2 years)
 - print subscribers - free online
 - subscribers to the print version - online for an additional fee
 - purchasing print or online version only
 - membership in companies that publish the magazine
 - consortium approaches (Springer, Elsevier, Wiley, Oxford, etc.)

Technical Terms

- PC connected to the Internet with a browser
- full texts are in the format:
 - HTML
 - PDF (Adobe Acrobat - free download)
 - exceptionally different format (image)
- ensuring access
 - direct access – IP-addresses of the institution, rarely ID and password
 - remote access - your personal ID and password

Magazine Catalogs

- file catalogs
 - records of magazines that are taken out in printed or online form by libraries in the Czech Republic - completeness depends on the cooperation of libraries
- National Medical Library – MEDVIK
- National Library of the Czech Republic - SKCP database
- catalogs of online magazines
 - 1. LF UK – Electronic journal library – EZB
 - UK - Electronic Journal Portal - SFX
 - NLK – Portal of electronic resources
- service for obtaining an article - MVS, MMVS

EZB (Electronic Journal Library)

- project of the German university library in Regensburg
- offers simple access (and especially management) of electronic journals
- you can find the availability of individual titles here
- easy search - by title, abbreviations, publisher, subject (in German), ISSN
- accessibility - "traffic light"
 - green (free source)
 - yellow (license for our organization – 1.LF)
 - red (we do not have access)

How about a magazine?

Example 1

- I have a quote:

Clinical Chemistry & Laboratory Medicine 2006, 44(7): 813-16 (Gibelin P et al: Prognostic value...)

- I will find out if 1st LF has it online
- EZB - I'm looking for "clin chem lab med" in the quick search
- appears at the magazine
 - "info" - information about the magazine
 - "readme" - info about subscription
 - "traffic lights"
- select a record that is accessible (yellow)
- I will link to the magazine page
- I will find the necessary article
- I will download

Example 2

- I have a quote:

Experimental Neurology 2006, 202(1): 21-35 (Bakker M et al: Postural responses...)

- I'll see if 1.LF has it online
- EZB - I'm looking for "experimental neurology" in the quick search
- appears at the magazine
 - "ičko" - information about the magazine
 - "readme" - info about subscription
 - "traffic lights"
- unfortunately, the journal is not accessible to us (red), but I can find out which library using EZB has it available - list of participating institutions
- I will look in the complete catalog
- National Medical Library - in 2006, it has no library in printed form
- The National Library of the Czech Republic - in 2006, there was no library in printed form
- I therefore choose the option from EZB - library - MVS service

E-resources portal - NLK

- registered NLK readers can use remote access
- NLK - SerialsSolution portal
 - <https://nlk.cz/> - "electronic resources" menu
- sample - "Lancet" magazine
- when accessing outside the NLK building, you must use a login ID and password (other than when accessing UK!)

- lists of e-books within the portal
 - 1.LF website, 1.LF library website - overview
- Gale demo
- sample Books@OVID
 - UK electronic resources portal - overview
- UK - ALEPH catalog
 - <http://ckis.cuni.cz>
- e.g. search by keyword - "psychology"
