

Multifocal fibrosclerosis

Multifocal fibrosclerosis (*systemic multifocal fibrosclerosis*) is a term for a group of **inflammatory diseases of unknown etiology** including at least some cases such as Riedel's thyroiditis, primary sclerosing cholangitis, insulin-dependent diabetes or Sjögren's syndrome. Currently, this designation is being abandoned, a significant part of such defined diseases probably represent organ-specific manifestations of IgG4-associated disease.
