

Osmolarity¹

Osmolarity is the amount of all osmotically active substances in 1 l of solution. It is equal to the product of molarity and the number of particles formed by dissociation of one molecule, expressed in osm/l.

Unlike osmolality, it is the amount of substances in the total volume of the solution (including dissolved substances). For highly diluted aqueous solutions, the value of osmolarity and osmolality hardly differs, because 1 L of water is approximately equal to 1 kg of water and the amount of dissolved substances can be neglected.
