

Pseudodementia

Pseudodementia is a subjectively perceived decline in memory and intellect, often occurring as a result of depression or anxiety states. Unlike organic dementia, it subsides with compensation causing mental disorders and has no morphological correlate.^[1]

Dissociative pseudodementia includes **Ganser's syndrome**, which appears in difficult life situations in predisposed individuals.^[2]
